

# Statistical Bulletin

## Enrolments at UK Higher Education Institutions: Northern Ireland analysis 2008/09

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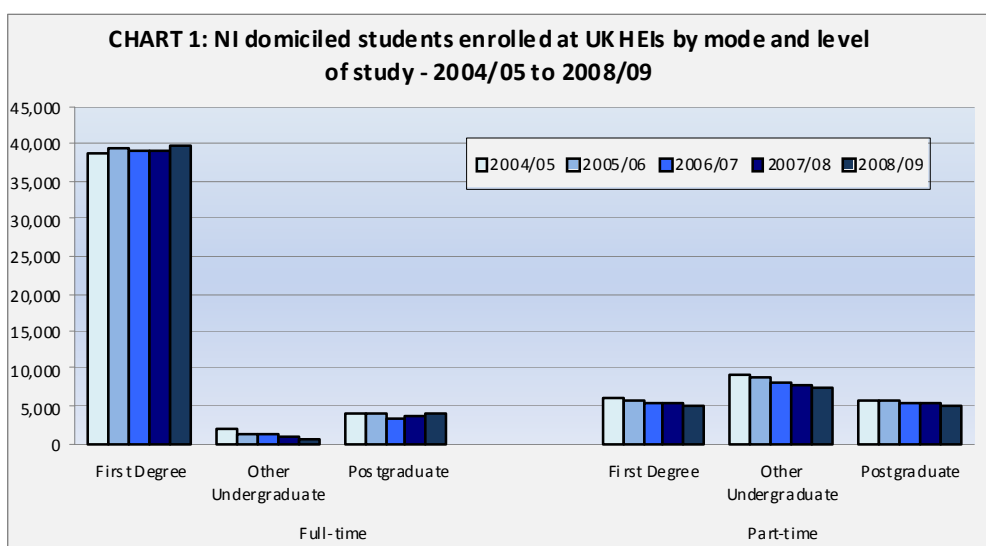
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This statistical bulletin has been produced by the Department for Employment and Learning, Northern Ireland (NI), using data collected by the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA).

The bulletin focuses on students enrolled at Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in NI and NI domiciled students enrolled at HEIs in the United Kingdom (UK) in the academic year 2008/09. A time series of enrolments covering the period 2004/05 to 2008/09 is also included.



## KEY POINTS

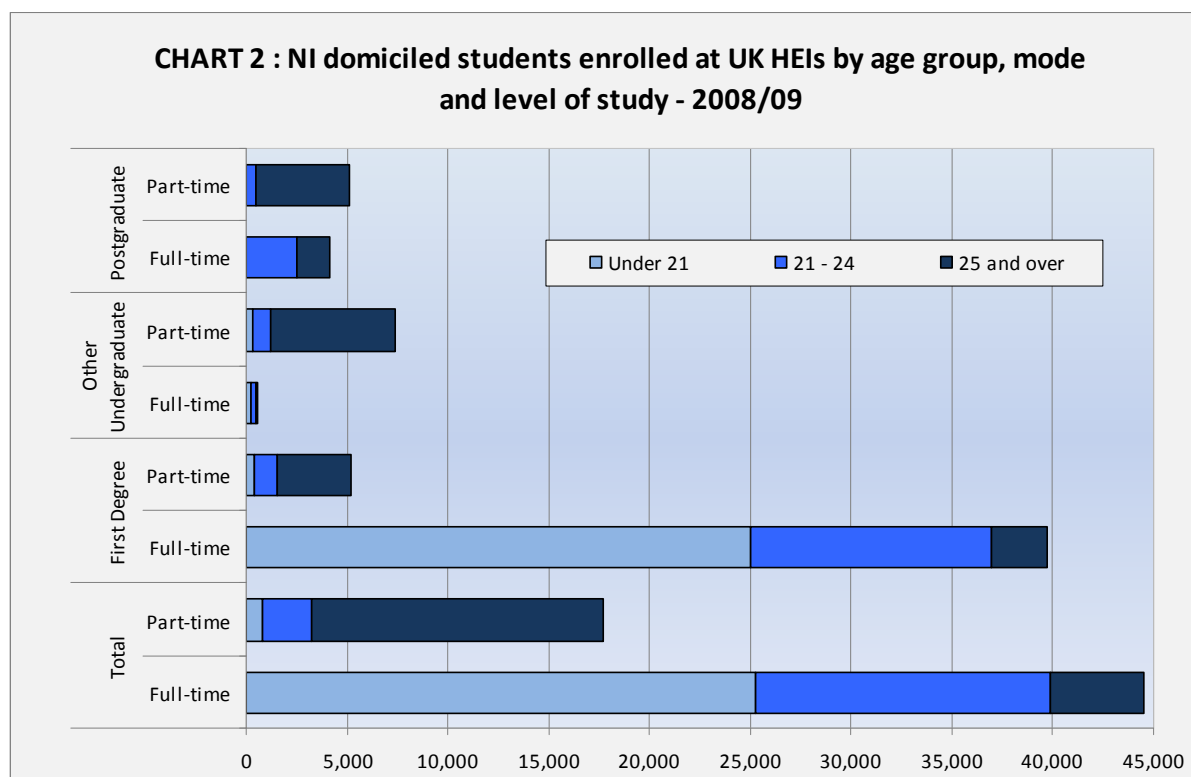
### Northern Ireland domiciled students enrolled at UK Higher Education Institutions (Tables 1 to 5)

#### Total Enrolments (Tables 2 & 5, Charts 1 & 2)

- In 2008/09 there were 62,265 NI domiciled students enrolled at UK HEIs, showing no percentage change from 2007/08.

Of those 62,265 enrolments:

- Gender - 59% were female and 41% were male.
- Age – 42% were ‘under 21’, 27% were aged ‘21 to 24’ and 31% were ‘25 or over’.
- Mode of study - The majority, 71%, were enrolled on a full-time basis, with 29% enrolled part-time.
- Level of study - 72% were undertaking First Degree courses, 13% were undertaking Other Undergraduate courses and 15% were enrolled on Postgraduate courses.



## Full-time First Year Undergraduate Enrolments

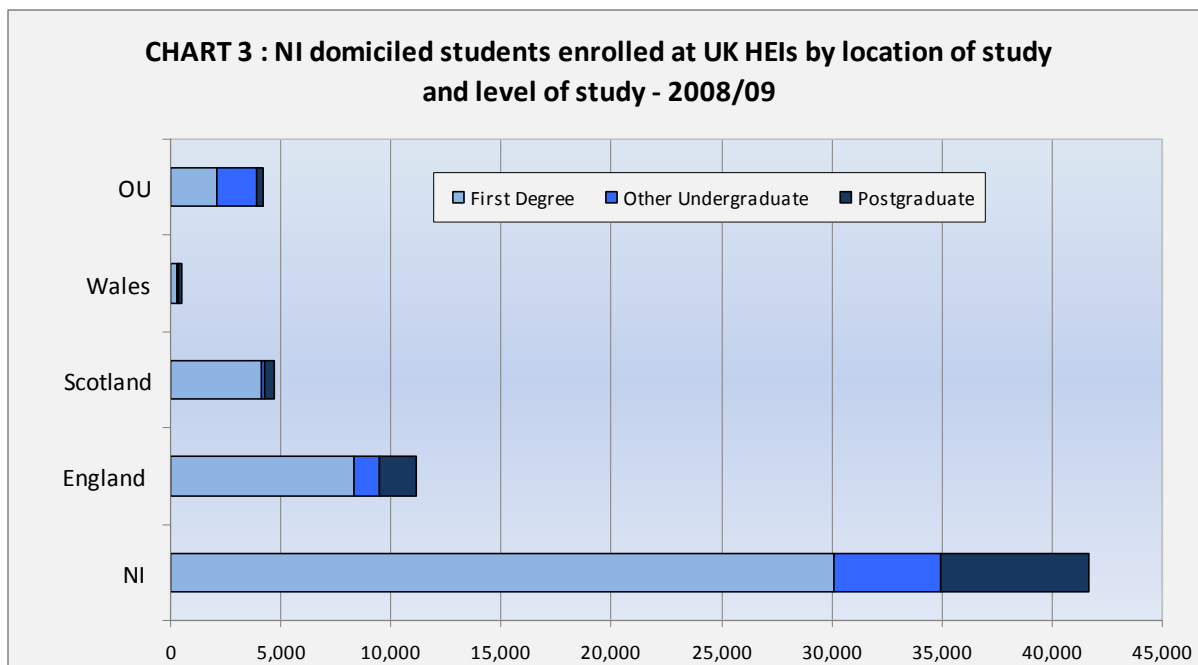
- The number of NI domiciled full-time first year undergraduate enrolments at UK HEIs has decreased from 13,650 in 2007/08 to 13,620 in 2008/09, which represents no percentage change.

Of those 13,620 enrolments:

- Gender – 58% were female and 42% were male.
- Age – 83% were ‘under 21’, 10% were aged ‘21 to 24’ and 7% were ‘25 or over’.

## Location of Study (Table 1, Chart 3)

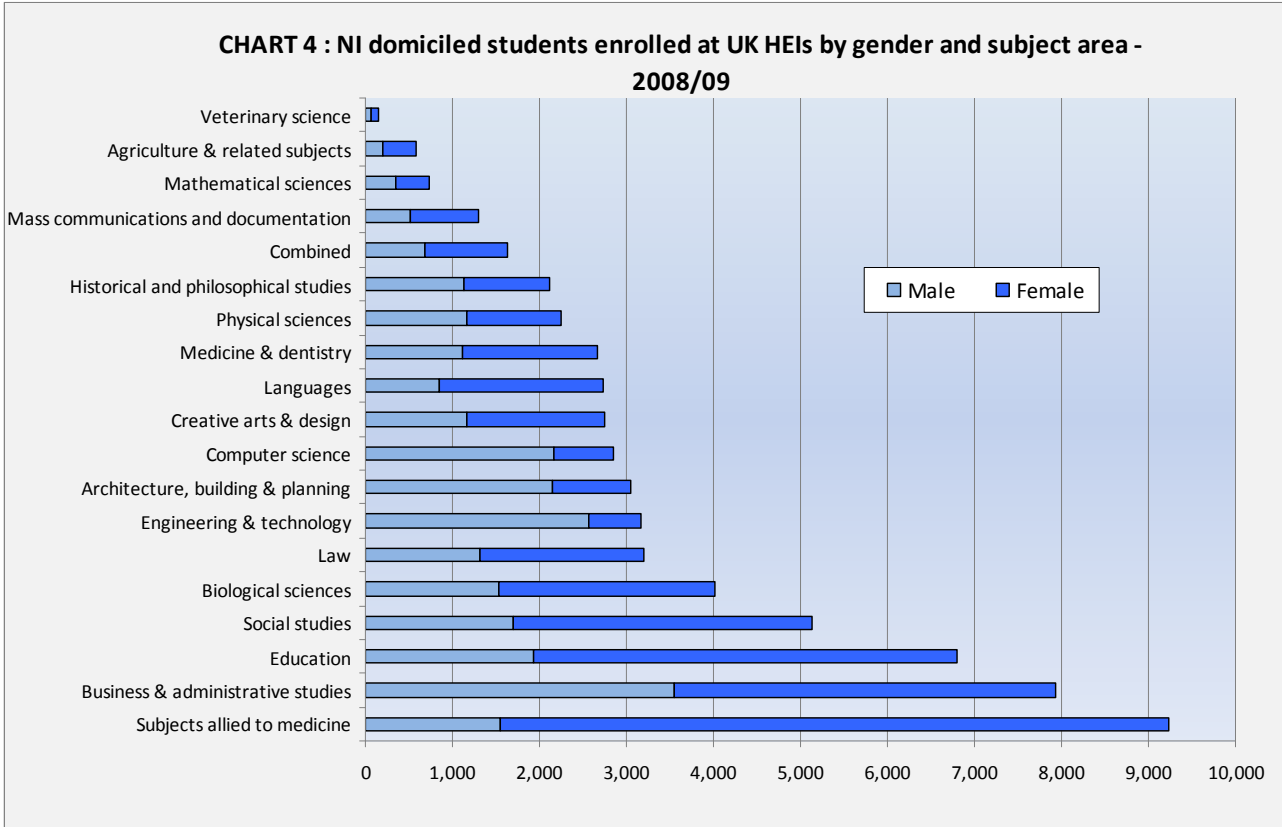
- Of the 62,265 NI domiciled students enrolled at UK HEIs in 2008/09, 67% were enrolled at a NI HEI, 18% at an English HEI, 8% at a Scottish HEI, 7% at the Open University and less than 1% at a Welsh HEI.
- Approximately 29% of NI domiciled males enrolled at a UK HEI were enrolled at an English (excluding the Open University), Scottish or Welsh institution, compared to 25% of females.



- Of the 13,620 NI domiciled full-time first year undergraduate enrolments at UK HEIs in 2008/09, 69% were enrolled at a NI HEI, 22% at an English HEI, 8% at a Scottish HEI and less than 1% at a Welsh HEI.

**Subject of Study (Table 3, Chart 4)**

- In 2008/09 the most popular subject areas of NI domiciled students studying at UK HEIs were ‘subjects allied to medicine’ with 9,230 enrolments (15%) and ‘business & administrative studies’ with 7,925 enrolments (13%).
- Females accounted for 83% of enrolments on ‘subjects allied to medicine’, 72% of those studying ‘education’ and 69% of those studying ‘languages’. Males accounted for 81% of those studying ‘engineering & technology’, 76% of ‘computer science’ enrolments and 70% of ‘architecture, building & planning’ enrolments.



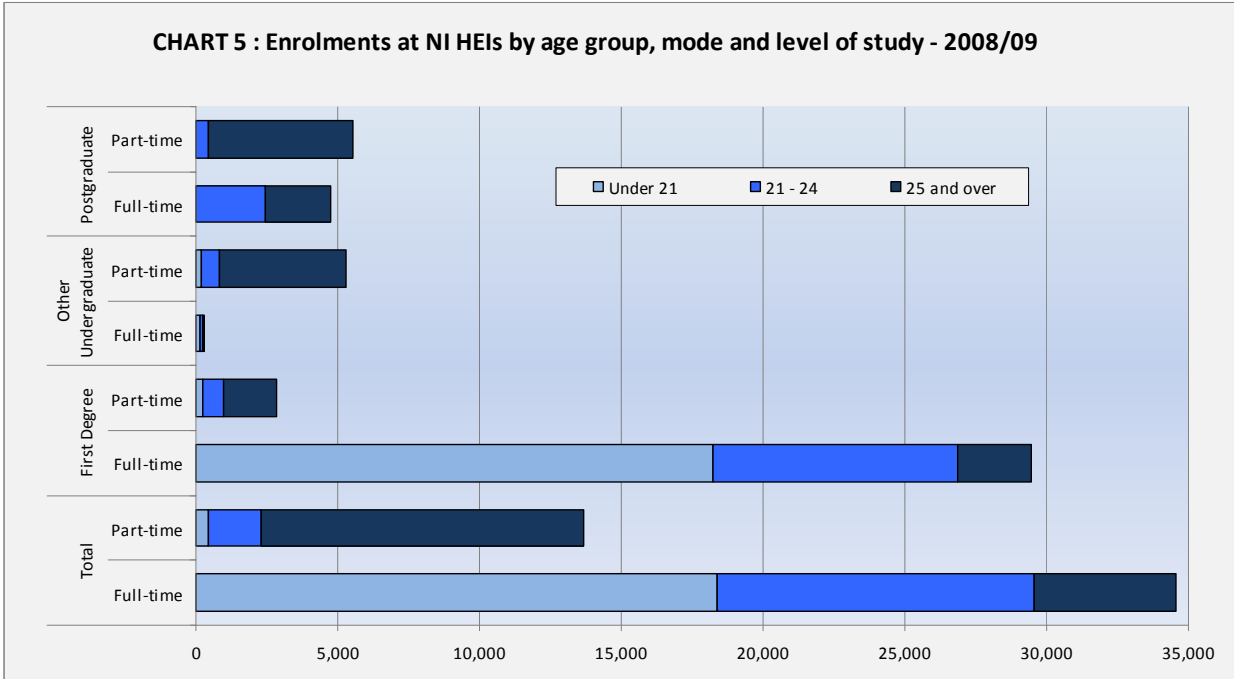
**Enrolments at Northern Ireland Higher Education Institutions (Tables 6 to 10)**

**Total Enrolments (Tables 7 & 10, Chart 5)**

- In 2008/09 there were 48,240 students enrolled at NI HEIs, showing no percentage change from the 2007/08 figure of 48,200.

Of those 48,240 enrolments:

- Gender - 60% were female and 40% were male.
- Age - 39% of students were aged 'under 21', 27% were aged '21 to 24' and 34% were '25 or over'.
- Mode of study - 72% of students were enrolled on a full-time basis, with 28% enrolled part-time.
- Level of study - the majority of students, 32,330 (67%), were enrolled on First Degree courses, 5,635 (12%) were undertaking Other Undergraduate courses and 10,280 (21%) were undertaking Postgraduate courses.



**Full-time First Year Undergraduate Enrolments**

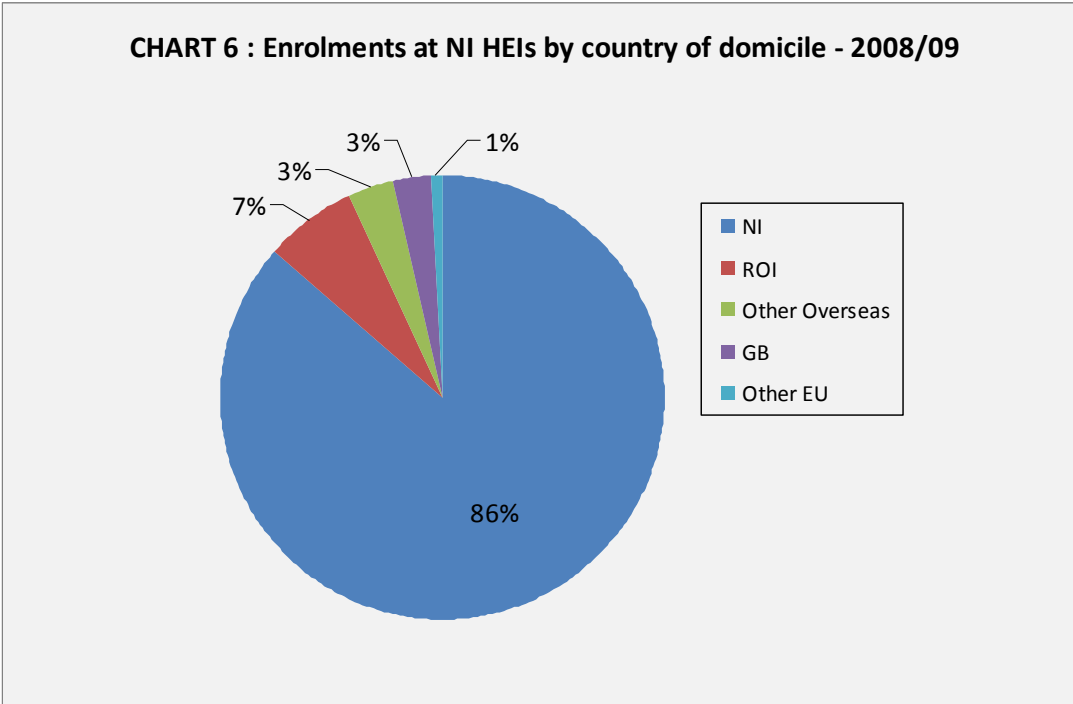
- The number of full-time first year undergraduate enrolments at NI HEIs has increased by 1% from 10,185 in 2007/08 to 10,245 in 2008/09.

Of those 10,245 enrolments:

- Gender – 59% were female and 41% were male.
- Age – 80% were ‘under 21’, 11% were aged ‘21 to 24’ and 8% were ‘25 or over’.

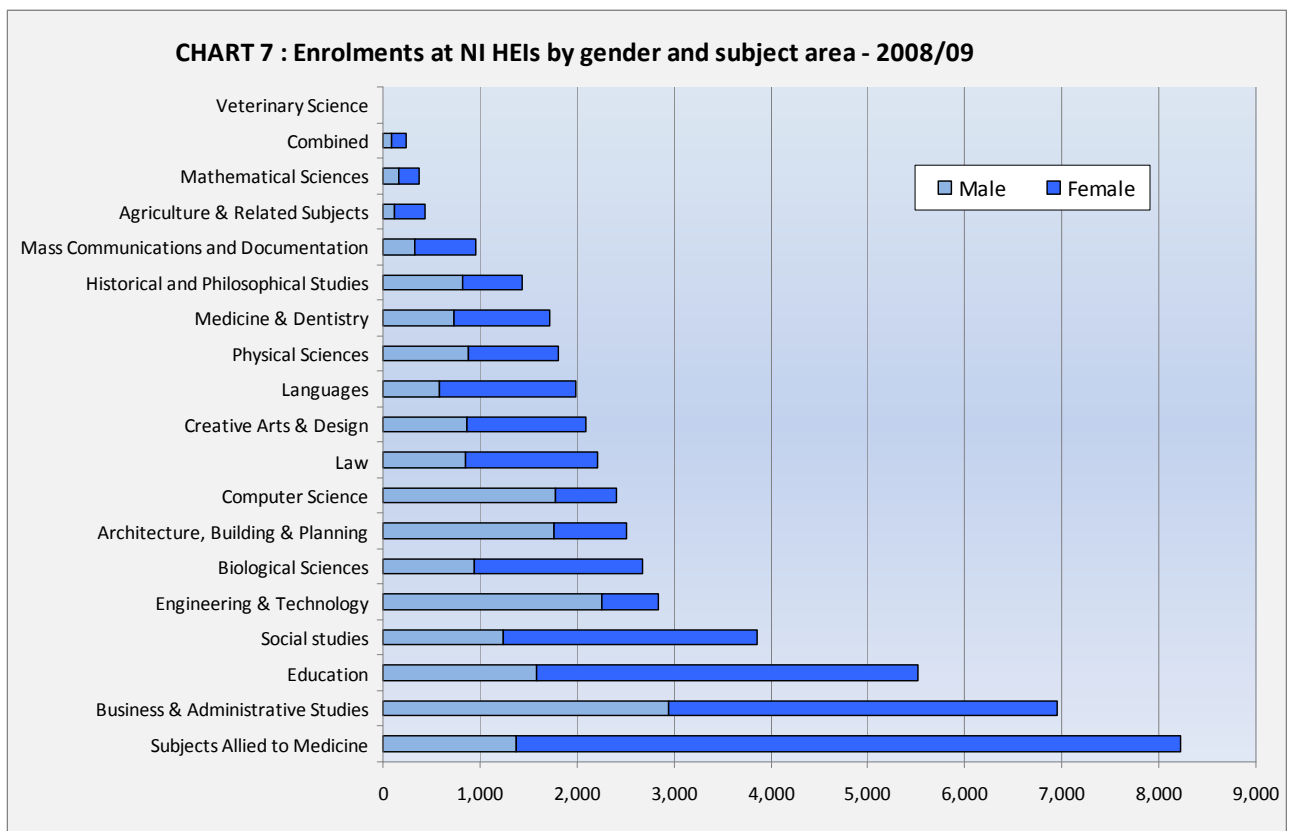
**Country of Domicile (Table 6, Chart 6)**

- 86% of the 48,240 students enrolled at NI HEIs in 2008/09 were domiciled in NI prior to entering HE.
- 7% were domiciled in the Republic of Ireland, 3% in Great Britain, 1% in Other EU countries and 3% from Other Overseas countries.



## Subject of Study (Table 8, Chart 7)

- In 2008/09 the most popular subject areas of students studying at NI HEIs were 'subjects allied to medicine' with 8,225 enrolments (17%) and 'business & administrative studies' with 6,960 enrolments (14%).
- Females accounted for 83% of enrolments on 'subjects allied to medicine', 71% of those studying 'education' and 71% of those studying 'languages'. Males accounted for 79% of those studying 'engineering & technology', 73% of 'computer science' enrolments and 70% of 'architecture, building & planning' enrolments.



## Notes to Readers

### General

- 1. A new specification of the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) Standard Registration Population was introduced for 2007/08 enrolments and onwards. Writing up and sabbatical students are now excluded from this population where they were previously included in published enrolment data. In order to maintain time series accuracy, all historical data will now use the 2007/08 definition of the Standard Registration Population (excluding writing up and sabbatical students.) As a result, enrolment data may not match other published HESA data prior to 2007/08.**

The table below shows the change in figures when comparing the old and new definition of the HESA Standard Registration Population

2. HESA is the official agency for the collection of information on publicly funded Higher Education (HE) institutions in the UK. It was set up in 1993 following the White Paper 'Higher Education: a new framework', which called for more coherence in HE statistics. HE institutions include all publicly-funded universities. HESA data relate to students in HE institutions in the UK but do not include students on HE courses at Further Education (FE) colleges in Northern Ireland (NI) or Great Britain (GB) nor at institutions in the Republic of Ireland (ROI).
3. There has been a change to the format of the Higher Education enrolments statistical bulletin for the 2008/09 academic year. The bulletin now contains HESA data only (i.e. data on enrolments at UK HEIs only). Information on enrolments on HE courses at NI and GB FECs, ROI institutions and The College of Agriculture, Food and Rural Enterprise (CAFRE) will be available via a separate statistical fact sheet which will be published on the Department's website in Spring 2010 ([www.delni.gov.uk/statistics](http://www.delni.gov.uk/statistics)).
4. The HESA Student Record contains information about individual enrolments which, because a student can be enrolled on more than one programme of study, will exceed the number of students.
5. The academic year runs from 1<sup>st</sup> August to 31<sup>st</sup> July.
6. The 2008/09 HESA student record contained 270 students enrolled at a HE institution in NI whose domicile had been incorrectly recorded as 'Non EU'. The HE Institution later confirmed that the domicile for these students should have

been NI and subsequently DEL statisticians recoded the 2008/09 HESA student record to take account of this.

7. The 2006/07 HESA student record contained 955 students enrolled at a HE Institution in NI whose domicile had been recorded as unknown. The HE Institution later confirmed that the domicile for these students should have been NI and subsequently DEL statisticians recoded the 2006/07 HESA student record to take account of this.
8. A change in reporting practice at a HE institution in NI has contributed to the large decrease that has been observed in the number of postgraduate students in 2006/07 compared to previous years. It means that the number of postgraduate students (or totals containing postgraduate figures) in 2006/07 cannot be compared accurately with data for previous years.

## **Definitions**

### **Higher Education**

9. Higher education students for the purpose of HESA's data collection are those students on courses for which the level of instruction is above that of level 3 of the Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA) National Qualifications Framework (NQF) (e.g. courses at the level of Certificate of HE and above).

### **Count of Students**

10. HESA data are a count of enrolments across the entire academic year as opposed to a snapshot of enrolments on the 1st December/1st November (which was the basis of the student count in HE statistical publications published by the Department prior to 2002/03).

### **First year students**

11. First year students are based on the HESA standard registration population who commenced their instance in the reporting period relevant to the data collection year. The term 'instance' is used to describe a student's engagement with the Institution aiming towards the award of a qualification(s) or credit.

### **Domicile**

12. Domicile refers to a student's permanent place of residence prior to enrolment on an HE course.
13. Student enrolments recorded with domicile UK region unknown, Channel Islands and Isle of Man are included in the GB category for the purposes of this statistical bulletin.

## Level of course

### 14. Level of study

- I. *Postgraduate* programmes of study are those leading to higher degrees, diplomas and certificates (including Postgraduate Certificate of Education (PGCE) and professional qualifications) and usually require that entrants are already qualified to degree level (i.e. already qualified at level 6 of the QCA National Qualifications Framework).
- II. *First degree* includes first degrees with or without eligibility to register to practice with a health or social care or veterinary statutory regulatory body, first degrees with Qualified Teacher Status (QTS)/registration with a General Teaching Council (GTC), enhanced first degrees, first degrees obtained concurrently with a diploma and intercalated first degrees.
- III. *Foundation degrees* were first introduced in September 2001. They are vocational higher education qualifications and are at level 5 of the QCA National Qualifications Framework.
- IV. *Other undergraduate* includes qualification aims equivalent to and below first degree level, such as Professional Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE), foundation degrees, diplomas in HE with eligibility to register to practice with a Health or Social Care or veterinary statutory regulatory body, Higher National Diploma (HND), Higher National Certificate (HNC), Diploma of Higher Education (DipHE), Certificate of Higher Education (CertHE), foundation courses at HE level, NVQ/SVQ levels 4 and 5, post-degree diplomas and certificates at undergraduate level, professional qualifications at undergraduate level, other undergraduate diplomas and certificates including post registration health and social care courses, other formal HE qualifications of less than degree standard, institutional undergraduate credit and no formal undergraduate qualifications.

## Mode of attendance

### 15. Mode of attendance distinguishes students studying full-time or part-time:

- I. *Full-time* students are those normally required to attend an Institution for periods amounting to at least 24 weeks within the year of study, on thick or thin sandwich courses, and those on a study-related year out of their institution. During that time students are normally expected to undertake periods of study, tuition or work experience which amount to an average of at least 21 hours per week.
- II. *Part-time* students are those recorded as studying part-time, or studying full-time on courses lasting less than 24 weeks, on block release, or studying during the evenings only.

## **Age**

16. Age is as at 31<sup>st</sup> August within the relevant academic year.

## **Gender**

17. From 2007/08, the field 'gender' changed to be consistent with the Aligned Data Definitions adopted by the Information Standards Board for education, skills, and children's services. Students of 'indeterminate gender' are included in total figures but not in separate breakdowns.

## **Changes to subject areas from 2002/03**

18. From 2002/03 subject area groups have changed due to a new common subject coding system (JACS) in which enrolments are aggregated to 19 broad subject areas. Although the new subject areas look similar and are closely related to the subject areas used in previous years, the new system is not by any means identical, as the subject categories within each group may have changed. In addition a new procedure for apportioning students to subject areas was introduced in 2002/03.

## **Rounding strategy**

19. To prevent the identification of individuals, figures in the attached tables are rounded to the nearest 5, with 0, 1, 2 rounded to 0. Due to rounding the sum of numbers in each row or column may not match the total shown. Percentages are based on the rounded figures.

## **Government Targets**

20. Data from this bulletin are used in the measurement of the following Public Service Agreement (PSA) targets and goals set in the Northern Ireland Executive's Programme for Government:

PSA 2 objective 4 - Increase by 5% the numbers studying STEM subjects in post 16 cohort by 2011.
